

Originally established as a fur trading post, Grande Prairie became an agricultural settlement after the turn of the 20th century. However, the region's wealth of natural resources including oil, natural gas, coal, and lumber has helped Grande Prairie continue to grow and prosper.

Strategically situated to serve residents from northeastern British Columbia, northwestern Alberta and as far away as the Yukon and Northwest Territories, Grande Prairie is a vibrant regional hub with something for everyone. Grande Prairie's strategic location has

contributed to its rapid growth over the years, and the city has developed into one of the fastest growing communities in Canada. As of 2016, the city has a population of over 63,000, with a broader trading area of over 281,000.

As the largest commercial centre north of Edmonton, Grande Prairie is home to many large retailers not often found outside of major cities. The variety of shopping and recreation opportunities in the city attracts shoppers and visitors from a broad region, contributing to the bustle in this regional hub.

Grande Prairie is a four-season playground with an abundance of indoor and outdoor activities to keep residents and visitors busy throughout the year. Whether it's surfing at the state-of-the-art Eastlink Centre, walking the trails of Muskoseepi Park, or planning a camping trip into the Rockies, Grande Prairie is abundant in recreational opportunities. Those looking for a mountain adventure, untamed Rockies and rapids await them in Grande Cache, while Jasper National Park offers visitors world-class skiing, hot springs, restaurants and more. To the north you will encounter the majestic Peace River Valley while crossing the historic Dunvegan Bridge.

The city boasts a number of accessible parks, golf courses and spectacular green spaces while the foothills south of Grande Prairie provide year-round entertainment for hikers, bikers, campers, snowmobilers, skiers, and outdoor recreationalists.

Sports enthusiasts can cheer on the Grande Prairie Storm at an AJHL hockey game or catch one of the major local, national or even international sporting events that Grande Prairie has become known for hosting. Recent sporting events have included the 2015 Tour of Alberta, the 2015 Canada Cup of Curling and the 2016 Scotties Tournament of Hearts. Grande Prairie will host the 2018 Alberta Summer Games, July 19-22.

The city also has a vibrant arts and entertainment scene. Revolution Place hosts world-class acts like Rihanna, Keith Urban and Elton John while the Grande Prairie Live Theatre regularly showcases local talent and produces plays, concerts, film festivals and other events throughout the year. For a hands-on experience, the Centre for Creative Arts offers a range of classes to learn new skills in painting, pottery, photography and more. Those looking for inspiration can visit the Art Gallery of Grande Prairie, which houses the largest public art collection in the region. Meanwhile, the Grande Prairie Public Library next door is the perfect place to curl up with a good book and a latte.

With the youngest population in Canada, Grande Prairie has more kids heading into Kindergarten than adults heading into retirement. To support this population, Grande Prairie has developed a wide range of activities, supports and amenities for children and families. From the state-of-the-art recreational facilities to the contemporary schools and family friendly neighbourhoods, Grande Prairie is a great place to call home and raise a family.



With a median age of 30.3, well below the national average of 40.5 Grande Prairie is an exceptionally young city. Whether it is parents pushing a stroller, children filling the Eastlink Centre or families biking one of the many trails, there are signs of youth everywhere you turn.

Grande Prairie's youthfulness is a result of the growing opportunities presented by its role as a regional hub as well as the area's many natural resources. Grande Prairie's population grew 13.5% between 2011 and 2016 as people flocked to the area for job opportunities.

Grande Prairie is the youngest city in Canada and one of the fastest growing in North America.


Cost of Living

Being a city in northwestern Alberta, it is often believed that the cost of living in Grande Prairie is high relative to the rest of Canada or even the Province. However, the cost of living is very comparable with the rest of Alberta. With a high average household income and a discretionary income that is double the national average, Grande Prairie residents are accustomed to a comfortable lifestyle.

The local real estate market remains affordable. The City's construction remains busy with Building and Inspection Services issuing a

total of 3,026 permits in 2016. The annual average home price in Grande Prairie remained steady at \$295,859, a 7% decrease from 2015 and significantly lower than the provincial average of \$394,576 and the national average of \$490,495.

The average rent for a two bedroom suite in Grande Prairie remained affordable in 2016 at \$1,022 per month, compared to the province wide average of \$1,195.

Grande Prairie is located in Alberta's Peace Country, so named for the Peace River, which flows through the area. Before the arrival of European settlers, the prairie was home to the Beaver First Nation, with bands of Cree sometimes travelling through the region as well. Since the 17th century, the fur trade brought European explorers further and further west, and in 1793, Alexander Mackenzie became the first European to travel through the Peace River Region. In 1805, the initial fur trade post was established in the region on behalf of the North West Company.

A Hudson's Bay trading post was established near Grande Prairie in 1881. The beginning of the 20th century saw more settlers in search of farmland, and in 1910, the town site was laid out by the Argonaut Company. In 1911, a two-storey store was erected on the

corner of what is now 100th Avenue and 100th Street, and soon after, much of the Grande Prairie town site began to be taken up by various businesses, ready to serve the incoming settlers. Grande Prairie was incorporated as a village in 1914.

During the Great Depression, more settlers arrived from the drought-stricken southern prairies. They came north to farm the moist, fertile soils of the Peace. The Depression was difficult for people on the prairies, but thanks to the favourable weather conditions of the Peace River Region residents fared relatively well. Agriculture built the foundation of Grande Prairie in the early 20th century, and it remains important today. The region produces more grain than the entire province of Manitoba, as well as the largest share of the Canadian honey supply.

The discovery of oil at Leduc, Alberta in 1947 ignited a series of explorations leading to the discovery of bountiful reserves of oil and natural gas in the Peace Region. Though some exploration and drilling occurred in the early parts of the 20th century, it was the post-war explorations that spurred the oil and gas industry in the area. As more and more reserves were discovered, the economy expanded and the region's population increased dramatically. Today, the oil and natural gas industry has become integral to Grande Prairie's economic growth.

The second half of the 20th century was the beginning of an era of prosperity for Grande Prairie. The rapid economic and population growth in the town and region led to Grande Prairie becoming a City in 1958. This growth quickly drove up demand for infrastructure and workforce development. To address the region's growing need for post-secondary education; the Grande Prairie Junior College was established in 1965, becoming the Grande Prairie Regional College in 1974. The modern structure bordering Muskoseepi Park was designed by world-renowned architect Douglas J. Cardinal. Following the construction of the college was the opening of the Prairie Mall, attracting international stores and shoppers to the city.

Grande Prairie's role as a regional hub was enhanced in 1982 with the opening of the new Courthouse and Provincial Building to service the region's need for Alberta Government services. The opening of Crystal Park School in 1983 brought Grande Prairie the



first integrated school in Alberta combining regular school with programs traditionally only found in hospitals. Building on the region's success, a 161-bed hospital was opened in 1984 to accommodate a growing population base.

Grande Prairie continues to grow and expand every year. To accommodate the growing population, the Grande Prairie Regional Hospital is slated for completion in 2019. The new facility will function as a regional referral centre, providing health services to northwestern Alberta residents and allowing more northern patients to receive specialized and complex care, closer to home and with shorter wait times






City of Grande Prairie


Queen Elizabeth II Hospital

Visitors and new residents are often surprised at the diversity of shopping available in Grande Prairie. As the only major centre serving a regional population of over 281,000 people Grande Prairie is home to major chains not often found outside of major cities.

100 Parks

As a legacy project for the City of Grande Prairie's 100th Anniversary in 2014, 100 parks throughout the city were officially named after citizens who have contributed significantly to our city's history and helped make our community what it is today.

Bear Creek Outdoor Pool

The Bear Creek Outdoor Pool, a long-time community gem is scheduled to re-open in June 2018. The fully re-done facility will feature a water slide, games area, zero beach and swimming lanes for use throughout the summer months.

Dog Parks

For the four legged members of the family, the City of Grande Prairie has one fully fenced off-leash dog park, and three neighbourhood off-leash areas.

Ice rinks

The City maintains 11 outdoor community ice rinks including the Muskoseepi Park Skating Pond. In addition, the Neighbourhood Rink Program allows local homeowners an opportunity to build and maintain a small skating rink neighbourhood parks near their home. These rinks are maintained by volunteers and used throughout the winter for local skating.

Maskwoteh Park


At the North end of Muskoseepi Park, across from Centre 2000, Maskwoteh Park features 900 metres of new trails, picnic areas and three new playground areas for children to enjoy. These new areas feature an outdoor classroom, a fossil hunt section and a rocks and ropes area all with a unique dinosaur theme.

Muskoseepi Park

Muskoseepi Park runs through the centre of the city with 18 km of both paved and natural trails winding through the urban forest for walking, biking and cross country skiing. The park features two large playgrounds, a splash park, an all-season pond for fishing and skating, outdoor basketball, tennis and lawn bowling courts, mini golf, disc golf and bird watching facilities. Muskoseepi Park is the place to be for festivals and entertainment. Grande Prairie's Canada Day, Heritage Day and Municipal Government Day celebrations are held in the park and the outdoor amphitheatre with its hillside seating provides the stage for concerts, dance performances and other shows throughout the season. Community Garden

Young & Growing Population

At a population of 63,166, Grande Prairie is one of the youngest and fastest growing cities in North America. With more residents preparing for kindergarten than retirement, the median age of Grande Prairie is a youthful 30.3, well below the national average of 40.6. Grande Prairie's population grew 13.5% between 2011 and 2016 by attracting talented men and women for the many opportunities available.

A Diverse Economic Portfolio

Named Canada's Best Place for Business by Canadian Business and PROFIT in 2016, Grande Prairie is best known for its oil and gas activity. However, it is home to a wide range of industries. Grande Prairie's business-savvy community has been consistently recognized by the Canadian Federation of Independent Business as one of the most entrepreneurial communities in Canada, an ambition that can be seen across all of the city's major industries.

Forestry

Grande Prairie's forestry industry is one of the most important engines in the region with four large operators, International Paper, Weyerhaeuser, Canfor and Norbord. While it is unusual to see such a concentration of major operators in a city of Grande Prairie's size, these operations are among the most competitive in Canada and the top industrial employers in the region. Northwestern Alberta produces 40% of Alberta's pulp, 64% of its oriented strand board (OSB) and 50% of its timber.

Agriculture

Agriculture remains an important part of the Grande Prairie region.

Almost four million hectares of farmland in the Peace Country produce wheat, barley, hay, canola and alfalfa. Grande Prairie's world-renowned creeping red fescue helps keep lawns, parks and golf courses green across North America.



Tourism

Tourism has become an important industry for the area with attractions like the Eastlink Centre and the Philip J. Currie Dinosaur Museum adding to the draw of the region's natural beauty. Thanks to Grande Prairie's position on the route to the Alaska Highway and the many shopping and recreational opportunities that the city has to offer, Grande Prairie has become a hub for shoppers and tourists alike.

Retail

As a regional hub, Grande Prairie has established itself as a lucrative market for local and multi-national retailers. The city is the centre of an affluent region consisting of a trading area of 281,000 people representing \$3.7 billion in retail spending. As the population continues to grow, retail spending and demand for new stores continue to be supported by the young, fast growing city.

The city has a current retail inventory of 4.06 million square feet, including major retailers such as Costco, Best Buy and HomeSense. Total demand for retail is 5.02 million square feet, leaving residual demand for new stores at 958,000 square feet.

Energy

Grande Prairie continues to profit from the wealth of oil and gas resources in the area. Grande Prairie is well positioned as the major oil field service centre supporting both the Montney and the Duvernay, two of the largest plays in North America. Output from the Montney has doubled since 2012 and now comprises a third of Western Canada's natural gas production. By 2040, it is projected to make up more than half of the country's production. Grande Prairie-based companies service oil and natural gas activities in northwestern Alberta, northeastern British Columbia and into the Northwest Territories. This massive market aids in economic stability, keeping companies and employees working during periods of world economic uncertainty.



Aboriginal Business and Entrepreneurship Development


